

SUPPLEMENT

On October 12, 2020 around 2231 hours I, Officer Tyler Kammerzell, was at the station typing reports while night shift had cleared and was taking calls for service. While I was typing reports I overheard officers say over the radio that shots were fired.

I self-dispatched to the call, located at 2290 Avenue C ■■■ to provide assistance. When I arrived on scene I grabbed my camera and began taking pictures of the scene starting from 22nd Street West and in the alley between Avenue B and Avenue C. As I got to the scene of the shooting I continued taking photographs. I attempted to take photographs of the suspect who had been shot while medical staff was rendering aid.

I then spoke with Officer Grommes who provided a brief synopsis of where it occurred, what happened, and where to focus my photographs. I was told the black Chevrolet Impala bearing Montana license plates 22-2002C is where the suspect was located. The license plates also were inactive and it was suspected they did not belong to the vehicle. I was told the VIN numbers on the vehicle had purposely been scratched and covered as well.

I continued taking photographs of the vehicle. I noticed the vehicle had been spray painted black as you can see some over spray and areas where the paint had not completely covered. The vehicle appeared to originally be white. I then looked for the VIN from the front windshield and someone had used a blue marker attempting to cover or conceal it. I took photographs of this and then looked at the driver's door for the VIN as well. I noticed this part of the vehicle had also been spray painted and someone again used a blue marker to attempt to cover the VIN. I took photographs of this as well.

I was informed additional officers were also taking photographs and was requested by Sgt Lennick to transport one of the two occupants of the other vehicle, a 2013 red Chevrolet Impala bearing Montana license plate 22-3962C, to the police station. I stopped taking photographs and took one of the two female occupants, identified as Dalore Hugs, to my patrol vehicle. I conducted a pat search for weapons and placed Dalore into my patrol vehicle. I confirmed her name and date of birth with her. I then tried to verify the information through dispatch and was informed her name was possibly Dalore Deputee. A NCIC/CJIN query confirmed they were the same person.

I then transported Dalore to the police station and had her sit in an interview room. Sgt Becker then informed me he would watch over Dalore at the station. I burned the photographs to a disc, provided that disc to Sgt Becker, turned in the photo card, and cleared from the scene.
