

SUPPLEMENT

On 10-12-20 I, Officer Schultz, was on uniformed patrol in my marked patrol veh when I overheard on the radio "shots fired". I was at N 27th St/4th Ave N. I immediately activated my overhead lights, siren, figured out who had called out shots fired, and ran "code" to where they were at in the 2200 block of Ave C. As I was coming in Officer Bickford advised that they were in the alley just South of Ave C, between Ave B.

I drove up to where they were and parked my car on the street as the ambulance was just coming up as well. I ran up to where they were, approximately in the middle of the alley, directly South of the apartments. I approached Officer Nelson, coming up behind as he was under the car port, facing the buildings. I observed a male laying on the ground and could see blood pooling around him. I looked at each officer that was there and asked if everyone was alright. Everyone confirmed they were okay. Officer Nelson was pulling security on the suspect. I relieved him, sending him with Officer Bickford and took over pulling security of the suspect.

At this point medical arrived on scene and I assisted them by shinning my flashlight on the suspect so they could see and work. While doing this I worked with other officers in preserving the crime scene, alerting medical of when they were nearing evidence. Once they were done I stayed where I was at, preserving the crime scene until I was told I could leave by Lt. Finnegan. From there I cleared the call and returned to patrolling.

I was on a call at City Hall with Sgt Becker advised me that detectives were wanting officers to speak with the females that had been transported to city hall. I spoke with Dalore Hugs (██████). I was told to seize her phone so I asked her where her phone was. She advised me that her phone had been stolen a few days ago and she hadn't gotten a replacement.

I read Hugs the Miranda Warning and she agreed to speak with me. She advised me that she didn't know the suspect. Her friend Nicole knew him. She had known Nicole for a "few years" now. She met Nicole through her sister. They were both at Nicole's apartment at the Big Sky apartments off of 8th Ave N. Hugs advised that Nicole got a phone call from the suspect to come and give him "a boost" which she then explained was a jump start. They both got into Nicole's red passenger car and went over to the Ave C apartments where they met up with the suspect.

Hugs advised that she never got out of the car and never talked to the suspect. I asked her when police arrived if they spoke with her and had her step out of the car. She advised me that police never spoke with her and she was never told to get out of the car.

This was all the information I was able to get out of her. I concluded my statement at this time and uploaded it to the server. I then cleared the call again with no further involvement.
